Restoring the Lacey Lady to fly again!

At our year end appeal in Dec. of 2021 our dedicated supporters donated \$50,000 to rebuild the cockpit structure of the Lacey Lady.

Jack Redding leads the restoration of the cockpit/bombay/radio compartment and eventually the Fuselage. He has temporarily married the Bombay and Nose Section to the Cockpit. This provides an exact precision match for the continued rebuild. Jack is training and leading his team in the continued rebuild of interior components for the cockpit as well its external structure.


Jack and his team have established a list of accomplishments in 2022 including: construction of the instrument panel and continuing internal structure restoration. With careful financial management and a



fiscally responsible attitude, we have accomplished 50% more work than expected. This is largely due to the generosity of our supporters. Due to in-kind donations and careful planning, we should have the cockpit structure completed by Sept. 2023.







This organization quickly grew beyond the restoration of a B-17G to become the three-part mission of Preservation, Education and Inspiration. We accomplish this by both restoring the Lacey Lady and collecting stories for the WWII Education Center.

landmark for nearly 70 years, and she is one of fewer than 50 B-17's in the world. A magnet for veterans, it became evident that this aircraft had a bigger purpose. This duty prompted the Bomber family, to begin a journey to preserve this piece of American history to educate generations. The Lacey Lady is the centerpiece for a WWII Education Center that honors the American spirit every day.

In 1947 on a \$5.00 bet, Art Lacey flew his Flying Fortress from Altus, Oklahoma to become the legendary Bomber Gas Station along the "super" hwy in Milwaukie, OR. During a tour of the B-17 Alliance Museum, guests get a glimpse into this *Incredible Journey* and the unique entrepreneur that the late Art Lacey was. Due to Art's

determination and courage and the Bomber family's generosity, this B-17 exists to benefit the community.

As an airworthy restoration, systematic procedures have and are being developed. Crew leaders strategize daily. Seeing her fly is a strong motivator for supporters, volunteers and crews.

Prior to moving to the Salem Airport, B-17 Alliance formed a board of directors who worked behind the scenes to get the entire Lacey Lady out of the weather,

engines. B-17 Alliance established a protocol early on to build business relationships and partner with credible individuals and corporations around the nation to promote common visions, elevate the cause and stretch each dollar.

In June of 2015 the B-17 Alliance Museum & Restoration Hangar opened at the historic Salem McNary Airfield. Finally, the Lacey Lady was out of the weather. The first phase of our "Flight Plan" was complete. In 2017 over 7000 volunteer hours were recorded and 15,000 visitors viewed the restoration of the Lacey Lady. A WWII educational destination point is developing with a vision for expansion.

WWII was a turning point for America. It cultivated the



"Greatest Generation." Corporations, factory workers, women, children, everyone pulled together for a common cause - for the United States.

The Lacey Lady, a World War II B-17G heavy Bomber represents all those who serve valiantly for our freedom. With community and corporate support, B-17 Alliance Foundation is returning the Lacey Lady to her flying glory.

Wing ONE SUCCESS CONTINUES.

In 2017 Lee Nielson began the disassembly of what we refer to as "Wing ONE".

This began with the removal of many elaborate accessory components including air duct systems, the Tokyo fuel tanks, landing gear and even a Ball Mason Jar that was used as an overflow for the battery.

The outer skins, corrugated sheet metal and numerous rib structures were removed until in Dec. of 2021 all that remained was the Spar section.

The spar is the strength of the wing. It is an important piece it carries the load for the wing structure. Inspection has been a challenge through the pandemic, but teams found innovative ways to continue on and overcome delays.

George McClellan is a volunteer. He owned his own Vintage Aircraft Restoration shop. George has generously donated his time and expertise. He will take over the restoration of Wing

Lee Nielson is a dedicated volunteer *Crew Member, he* oversaw the dismantle of Wing ONE and is now the Project Manager. Additional volunteers are needed to assist. Lee and his team train new volunteers.

This restoration will take many years. You can't just go down to the local market and purchase parts. Our target is 2035 for her maiden flight. That is an ambitious goal and will take approx. nine million dollars to accomplish. Over a million has already been invested in the restoration and establishment of the B-17 Alliance Museum & Restoration Hangar.

Establishing a "Restoration Shop" was one of the first steps in the B-17 Alliance "Flight Plan." A restoration to this magnitude takes precision and excellence. Aviation quality tools and hardware are required to do the job.


